INTERNATIONAL TOURISM REPORT: OVERVIEW OF ACCOMMODATION PERFORMANCE

1. Key markets and trends

1.1 Overview

International visitors to Australia spent a record \$40.6 billion in the year ending June 2017 – an increase of \$2.5 billion (6.54%) on the previous year. International visitor nights increased 7.29%.

In terms of reasons for travel, the holiday and education segments recorded expenditure growth of 5% and 18%, respectively. Holiday visitor nights grew 5%, while education visitor nights grew 17%.

In capital cities (including Gold Coast), total visitor nights in the 'Hotels, Motels, and Resorts' category grew 9.4% to 23.1 million. The strongest growth was in Melbourne (22%) and Brisbane (13%). In regional locations, total visitor nights in the same category grew 0.64%, with the strongest growth in the Northern Territory (8%).

The number of international visitor nights in unregulated accommodation has grown 93% since 2008, growing from 64.8 million to 125.7 million. Over the same period international visitor nights in 'Hotels, Motels and Resorts' has grown 19.8% from 24.6 million to 29.4 million. As such, unregulated accommodation accounts for four times the number of international visitor nights as regulated hotel, resort, motel and serviced apartment accommodation.





5. Unregulated Accommodation

Tourism Research Australia has advised TAA that unregulated accommodation (i.e. Airbnb-type rentals) is presently recorded in two categories: 'Rented house/apartment/flat or unit' and 'Other Private Accommodation.' Accordingly, these two categories have been combined below and labelled 'Rented plus Other Private'.
